


Back-2-Back Atlantic Sun Champions





AT THE HELM... In her fifth year as UCF's head coach, Gail Striegler guided the squad to a 17-13 overall record and a 14-6 conference mark. She accomplished several milestones during 2003-04, earning her 50th Atlantic Sun victory with the 68-39 win at Mercer on Feb. 26 and her 70th overall win in the season finale against Stetson on March 6.

GOLDEN GIRLS...Sophomore guard Celeste Hudson and junior center/forward Takira Allen both added postseason accolades to their resumes. Hudson was named First-Team All-Atlantic Sun, while Allen earned Second-Team All-Conference honors. Hudson and junior center Ali Roberts were rewarded for their efforts during the Atlantic Sun Tournament by being named to the All-Tournament Team.

PUTTIN' ON THE RITZ... In the final regular season game against Stetson, UCF's lone senior - forward Adrienne Billings - went out in style. After averaging around three blocks a game all season and just 20 away from hitting the 500 mark for her career, Billings grabbed a career-high 15 boards against the Hatters. She also recorded her seventh double-double of her career scoring 14 points.

Billings has made her mark in the UCF record books. She is currently second all-time with 109 blocks in her career and fifth all-time in shooting from the field

(50.8%).

TRIPLE THREAT... Sophomore guard Celeste Hudson was impressive from behind the arc all season as she finished the season second in the Atlantic Sun in three-pointers made per game (2.33) and sixth in three-point shooting percentage (34.8%).

Against Campbell on Feb. 19, Hudson tied the school record for most three-pointers made in a game with seven and continued to move up the ranks for most in a season and most in a career. She hit a total of 70 for the season and overtook Kelli Ely for first for most three's in a season. Combined with her 42 from her freshman season, Hudson has 112 in her two-year career and has moved into second all-time, just one shy of Ely's 113.

PLAYING THE FIELD... The Golden Knights finished the season second behind Georgia State in shooting from the floor with a 40.2%. UCF hit 701 of 1742 attempts. The defense held opponents to 34.3% shooting from the field, an effort that headlines the A-Sun standings.

Two UCF players were listed among the top five field goal shooters individually. Juniors Ali Roberts and Takira Allen were third and fourth. Roberts was 109 of 208

(52.4%) and Allen was shooting 164 for 316

(51.9%).

TOP DOG... The Golden Knights topped the Atlantic Sun in seven different statistical categories, including scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, rebounding offense, rebounding margin, blocked shots, assists and defensive rebounds.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE TROUBLE... Takira Allen and Celeste Hudson recorded nine of the 12 double-doubles during the 2003-04 season, including one each in the 68-63 win over Campbell on Feb. 19, while Adrienne Billings added one in the season finale and Ali Roberts added one in the

Atlantic Sun Tournament Championship game against Lipscomb. Hudson registered consecutive double-doubles in three straight games from Feb. 14-21, while Allen posted double-doubles against Georgia State (Feb. 28) and Jacksonville (March 4).

Allen currently has six double-doubles in her threeyear career, while Hudson has five. Billings now boasts seven.

ON THE GLASS... Traditionally, the Golden Knights have been one of the top rebounding teams in the Atlantic Sun and led the league with an average of 41.7 boards per game in 2002-03.

UCF bounced up and down the ranks of the conference during the 2003-04 season and was ranked as low as sixth. After jumping back to No. 1 during the week of Feb. 19, the team remained there with 44.7 rebounds per game.

Meanwhile, the Golden Knights moved to second in rebounding defense, allowing opponents to grab 37.9 rebounds. Mathematically, the Golden Knights were beating opponents on the glass by a +6.8 margin.

To prove how important rebounding is to UCF's game, consider the following: The Golden Knights were beaten on the glass seven times and only emerged with one victory in that situation.

UCF FOR THE BLOCK... No this isn't a game of Hollywood Squares, rather the Golden Knights are the top team in the A-Sun when it comes to knocking down opponents' shots. They were averaging 5.40 blocks per outing and boast four of the Top 15 shotblockers in the conference.

Sophomore Shelby Weber led UCF with 39 blocks and was seventh in the Atlantic Sun with 1.30 blocks per game. Just behind her with 38 blocks and ranking eighth in the conference (1.27 per game) is junior Ali Roberts followed by senior Adrienne Billings in 11th (1.10) and Takira Allen in 14th (0.93).

HOLDING COURT... The UCF coaching staff used six different lineups during the 2003-04 season. Only two players - junior Ali Roberts and sophomore Shayla Smith - started all 30 games.

The most successful and most frequently used of the Golden Knights' rotations featured juniors Takira Allen and Roberts and sophomores Smith, LaShay King and Celeste Hudson. Together, they had a 11-5 record.

LENDING A HAND... The Golden Knights had the most assists in the Atlantic Sun with an average of 15.00 per contest.

Three UCF players were ranked among the conference's Top 10 individually. Sophomore LaShay King was third with 4.14 assists per game, while her

THIS JUNIOR IS MINT... Junior center Takira "Tater" Allen was named the Atlantic Sun's Preseason Player of the Year before the start of the 2003-04 season. She did not allow the pressure of that title to effect her performance. She put up doublefigures on the scoreboard in 23 of the 30 games and led the Golden Knight offensive charge in 10 different contests.

She had a season-high 22 points twice - once against Georgia State on Jan. 8 and again against Jacksonville on March 4. She also posted five double-doubles to bring her career total to six.

On March 1, Allen earned A-Sun Player of the Week honors after averaging 20 points and nine rebounds and shooting 63.3% from the floor during UCF's wins over Mercer and Georgia State.

CELESTIAL BEING... After being selected to the 2003 Atlantic Sun All-Tournament Team, Celeste Hudson showed that she was the real deal in her sophomore season. She finished the season first on the Golden Knights with 13.5 points per game,

an effort that ranked her seventh in the conference.

Hudson led the team in scoring in 16 of the 30 games and posted double

figures on 21 different occasions.

She boasted a career-high 28 points against Mercer on Jan. 10 and followed that with her first collegiate double-double when she posted 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds against Florida Atlantic on Jan. 13.

Hudson recorded three consecutive double-doubles at Troy State on Feb. 14 (10 points/10 rebounds), vs. Campbell on Feb. 19 (27 points/10 rebounds) and vs. Gardner-Webb on Feb. 21 (13 points/10 rebounds).

ALI CAT... Junior forward/center Ali Roberts continued to be a force both offensively and defensively for the Golden Knights.

On the season, she had made 109 of her 208 shots and had the highest shooting percentage on the team (52.4%). She posted a season-high 18 points in the win over Gardner-Webb on Feb. 21 and ranked third among the Golden Knights with 8.8 points per contest.

On the glass, Roberts had been the Golden Knights leading rebounder in seven games and was ranked third on the team with 5.3 rebounds per game.

Roberts also continued to build upon the career blocking record that she set in her sophomore year. Adding 38 blocks last season, she now has 146 career blocks. She is also ranked sixth on the A-Sun list for most blocks in a career and needs one more to takeover Phylette Blake's position at the No.

SLINGING HER WEB... Sophomore Shelby Weber also enjoyed tremendous success in her second season with the Golden Knights.

The forward started in 12 of 27 games in the 2003-04 season and registered 4.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. She was first on the team with 39 blocks. Combined with her 13 from last season, she is eighth alltime at UCF with 52 blocks in her career.

RETURN OF THE KING... Sophomore guard LaShay King started 20 of the 28 games she played last season and posted 5.1 points and 4.0 rebounds a game. She led the team in assists with 116.

When it comes to playing Florida Atlantic, the Port St. Lucie native holds nothing back. During the 72-61 win in Boca Raton on Dec. 12, King posted a career-high five steals. On Jan. 13 in Orlando, she scored a career-best 12 points and recorded a career-high nine assists.

SECOND HALF WOWS... Three times last season UCF had to overcome first period deficits to earn wins. The first came against Belmont on Jan. 31 at UCF Arena when the Bruins took a 30-27 lead at the half, but the Golden Knights won the contest 67-55.

UCF posted back-to-back come-from-behind victories at Troy State on Feb. 14 and against Campbell on Feb. 19.



RIVERDALE, N.1.— Rosalee Mason scored 21 points and had 14 rebounds leading Manhattan College to a 68-47 win over UCF at Draddy Gym. The game was the seasŏn ŏpener for both teams.

UCF kept things close in the first half until Manhattan's Nikoletta Deutsch found her range and connected on three of four 3-pointers. The Lady Jasper's went up by five at the 7:18 mark of the first half until UCF worked its way back and took a 21-20 lead off a layup by Takira Allen. Two turnovers by the Golden Knights gave Manhattan the opportunity to retake the lead (22-21) with 2:11 left in the first half. The Lady Jaspers went into the locker room at the half with a 27-21 lead.

In the second half, UCF could not get it's offense going and was unable to hold off Mason defensively. Mason

scored 18 of her 21 points in the second period, pushing the Manhattan lead to as much as 23 points. Allen and Ali Roberts each scored 11 points for the Golden Knights while Shelby Weber pulled down a team-high eight rebounds.

Purdue 87, UCF 52 November 28, 2003 at UCF Arena

ORLANDO – Katie Gearlds came off the bench to score 16 points as No. 8 ranked Purdue dealt UCF an 87-52 loss in the opening round of the Golden Knights

Classic.

The Boilermakers jumpstarted the game with eight unanswered points. They kept the Golden Knights without a field goal until Celeste Hudson sank a three-pointer at 15:20 to cut the visitor's lead to 14-5. Purdue's advantage climbed to 22-11 at 13:09 before both squads hit a scoring drought that lasted close to three minutes. Gearlds ended the Boilmakers' dry spell at 10:22 with a fastbreak layup, and a trey by LaShaunda Slade at 9:12 cut PU's lead to 12. From that point, Purdue took advantage of

their offensive opportunities to pull away and led by a first half high of 31 points at 2:58, but had to settle for a 51-21 favor at the intermission.

The Golden Knights shot better from the field in the second half going 9-for-26 (34.6%) even as Purdue saw their percentage drop to a still respectable 42.9% (12-for-28).
